Members of Parliament are your representatives in Parliament. You can contact them at their offices in the parliamentary complex or at their out-of-Parliament or electorate offices. This page tells you how to find contact details for members and Ministers, and how to address people in Parliament when you correspond with them.

To send a letter to all Members of Parliament

If you want to send a letter to all members of Parliament, send us 122 copies of your letter in one envelope. Include a covering note that asks us to distribute one copy to each member.

Address your envelope:

No postage stamp is needed when you are writing as an individual to a member of Parliament or a Minister. Postage is required if you are writing on behalf of an organisation.

This distribution service is available only for letters. We do not forward copies of emails to all members of Parliament or Ministers.

Speaker:	Dr The Rt Hon Lockwood Smith, Speaker of the House of Representatives	Dear Mr Speaker	Mr Speaker
Prime Minister:	Rt Hon John Key, Prime Minister	Dear Prime Minister	Prime Minister
Ministers:	Hon Joe Bloggs, Minister of ...	Dear Minister	Minister
Members of Parliament:	Hon Joe Bloggs MP or Mr Joe Bloggs MP	Dear Mr / Ms / Dr Bloggs	Mr / Ms / Dr
